Parks and Recreation Bonds

Additional property taxes may be levied on property
located in the City of Burlington, North Carolina in an
amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest
on bonds if approved by the following ballot ques-
tion. Shall the order adopted on July 16, 2024, autho-
rizing \$47,000,000 PARKS AND RECREATION BONDS
of the City of Burlington, North Carolina, plus interest,
for the purpose of providing funds, together with any
other available funds, to acquire, construct and equip
various parks and recreational facilities for said City,
including, without limitation, expansion and renova-
tion of the Paramount Theater, improvements to the
Maynard Aquatics Center and construction of a new
multi-sport complex in the western part of said City,
and the acquisition of any related land, rights of way
and equipment, and providing that additional taxes
may be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the prin-
cipal of and interest on said bonds be approved, in
light of the following: (1) The estimated cumulative cost
over the life of said bonds, using the highest interest
rate charged for similar debt over the last 20 years,
would be \$73,372,640, consisting of the \$47,000,000
principal amount of said bonds, plus 26,372,640 of
estimated interest. (2) The estimated amount of prop-
erty tax liability increase for each one hundred thou-
sand dollars (\$100,000) of property tax value to ser-
vice the cumulative cost over the life of said bonds
provided above would be \$34.00 per year.

Street and Sidewalk Improvement
Bonds

Additional property taxes may be levied on property
located in the City of Burlington, North Carolina in an
amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest
on bonds if approved by the following ballot ques-
tion. Shall the order adopted on July 16, 2024, autho-
rizing \$21,500,000 STREET AND SIDEWALK IM-
PROVEMENT BONDS of the City of Burlington, North
Carolina, plus interest, for the purpose of providing
funds, together with any other available funds, to ac-
quire, construct and equip various street and side-
walk improvements for said City, including, without limi-
tation, street resurfacing, sidewalk improvements and
streetscape improvements, and the acquisition of any
related land, rights of way and equipment, and pro-
viding that additional taxes may be levied in an amount
sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said
bonds be approved, in light of the following: (1) The
estimated cumulative cost over the life of said bonds,
using the highest interest rate charged for similar debt
over the last 20 years, would be \$33,564,080, con-
sisting of the \$21,500,000 principal amount of said
bonds, plus \$12,064,080 of estimated interest. (2) The
estimated amount of property tax liability increase for
each one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) of prop-
erty tax value to service the cumulative cost over the
life of said bonds provided above would be \$23.00
per year.
